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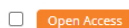
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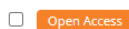
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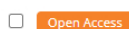
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Crime and victimisation in the era of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals

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Abstract

Crime and victimisation have reached epidemic proportions. By fostering sustainable development within the social, economic and environmental spheres, the United Nations envisaged the strengthening of crime prevention and justice. However, within the global North/South divide there is little reason to assume that criminological and victimological interventions, development programmes or economic reforms can ever fully resolve the underlying causes of many victimological harms that affect developing or developed countries, unless and until they lead to greater freedom, equality and justice. Intersecting inequalities and social and economic exclusion highlight the importance of context and the complex geopolitical, institutional and ideological landscapes that gave rise to this global agenda. Together with the associated challenges for the successful implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), a critical appraisal of the nexus between crime, victimisation, justice and sustainable development on account of the gravest threat to humanity, namely climate change and environmental degradation, remains a functional imperative for research, policy and practice.

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In *Nanaku*: Local Knowledge of The Coastal Fishermen Community Taniwel Seram

Abstract

This paper wants to explain how *Nanaku*, as local knowledge of the coastal community in Taniwel sub-district, western Seram Regency had an important role in the marine activities. The purpose of the study was to explain the local knowledge of the community related to the skills and accuracy in marking natural phenomena related to marine activities. This study used descriptive qualitative methods, which included data collection, data reduction, data presentation, and drawing conclusions or verification. The results showed that *Nanaku* was passed down from generation to generation. Through this local knowledge, they can hold the process of making boats and fishing in the sea properly. This local knowledge was used as a natural marker and fishing guideline. *Nanaku* consisting of twelve fishing skills: *nanaku* moon, *nanaku* karti star, *nanaku* beluku star, *nanaku* scaly clouds, *nanaku* high and low tide, *nanaku* whirl wind, *nanaku* ocean currents, *nanaku* when river water overflows/ floods, *nanaku* seagulls lock, *nanaku* owl (boel), *nanaku* lunar eclipse, and *nanaku* lightning in Northeast at night. The conclusion showed that *Nanaku* still survives today and was not lost in the midst of technological developments. *Nanaku* became a basic knowledge for a fishing profession which contributed to the economic life of the coastal fishing communities of Taniwel Seram.

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Woman's Voice Speaks Out for Gender and The Environment in *Gadis Pesisir*

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Abstract

The life of women in Indonesia's coastal areas tends to have limitations in accessing education. They are a minority group who often have to stay at home and do domestic work. The purpose of this paper is to explore the environmental issue, ecological, mixed with feminist criticism in *Gadis Pesisir*, a short story by Zainul Muttaqin. By defining the woman's minimum role in studying at the college and her desire to develop the coastal society, the author exposes the contrast between them, related to the coastal welfare and cultural conflicts between the gender relation and the spirit to advance the community. This research is a descriptive qualitative method that uses library research. Ecocriticism and feminist criticism are highlighting the interaction among literary text, nature, and women's voices. By raising this local issue, the writer described the women empowerment loss of patriarchy culture. This short story perpetuates the powerlessness of coastal women in fighting patriarchal culture, stigma, and the marine environment. They can only dream and wait for a miracle to change their destiny. It is contrary to women's rights which are fought for by feminists on the equality of women and men in accessing education, obtaining job opportunities, and careers in various fields.

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A Socio-Economic Proposed Theoretical Framework for Responding to The Covid-19 Outbreak

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Abstract

One of the significant impacts of the Covid-19 outbreak was the need for physical distancing. Physical distancing causes changes in the order of human life within a relatively short amount of time. Physical distancing also directly causes various socio-economic problems, especially for small-medium enterprise (SME) businesses. The background of this research is the absence of a theoretical framework related to the socio-economic impacts of the Covid-19 outbreak based on previous quantitative research publications. This research aims to develop a theoretical framework on the socio-economic constructs for response to a Covid-19. This research uses the literature review method. The research publication data used for the literature review comes from the Scopus database until May 1, 2020, with restrictions to only quantitative research publication documents. The publication of quantitative research as research data is only derived from the business subject and uses quantitative data processing tools based on structural equation modelling (SEM) variance and covariance. From the research results, a theoretical framework was developed on the role of socio-economic moderation on the effect of internal resources on organizational performance and the role of socio-economics as an antecedent of environmental behaviour. The proposed theoretical framework has the potential to be empirically tested in a future-related socio-economic response to a Covid-19 outbreak.

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
