Comments to the author

Reviewer 1: A fascinating read about the development of karawitan in Japan, with the historical context around how the gamelan was introduced and embraced by the Japanese being a particularly powerful element of the article. However, I do feel that there are two separate articles here (as opposed to one). There is the article that discusses the history of the gamelan in Japan, and there is the article that explores Japanese acceptance of gamelan through qualitative research. I understand that one cannot exist without the other, but in terms of the impact of each component in an academic journal, the reader may be able to draw more from each were they separate articles (even if they were in the same journal issue). The main split for me is where 'Gamelan's Group Activities: Similar pattern in socializing traditional culture' ends and 'Japanese Recognition on Karawitan' begins. It may be that the two sections need to be more clearly conceptually connected. The approach to do

this could be by providing a paragraph in the introduction that clearly states the link, and then provided another linking paragraph or section between the two sections. The link between the history of the arrival of the gamelan (and is subsequent development) and the acceptance of karawitan by the Japanese more broadly can be elaborated on.

*Title, Abstract and Introduction - overall evaluation

1. Acceptance of Javanese Karawitan in Japan: Appreciation of Traditional Culture and Community Activities' (slight grammatical change of current title)

2. Abstract - Is 'uprooted' the most suitable term to describe how Karawitan has spread around the globe (as 'uprooted' suggests it has taken its roots elsewhere)

3. Abstract - 'The Japanese have known...' - instead of current way of writing.

4. After reading the abstract, I am unsure what the main aim/objective of the article is. These sentence provide a description rather than clarity of objective: 'This study uses updated information on gamelan's community

activities that are published on Facebook as well as blogs, which are considered primary sources. It is known that due to the similarity in the efforts of appreciating traditional values, karawitan players can be able to transform their prays through

gendhing. In addition, performing karawitan possibly becomes their entertainment

5. If this article is aimed at a broader audience, it may help to provide single-word translations of 'karawitan' and 'gendhing' in the abstract, and the term 'wayang kulit purwa' in the introduction, amongst others.

6. Please be consistent with numerals i.e. 'XIX century' should be 19th century.

7. It would greatly help the reader to provide soem signposting of the structure of the paper in the introduction section.

8. Suggestion is to use a more succinct version of these sentences 'It is hoped that this research will complement existing studies on Javanese karawitan in foreign countries, by describing the process of the entry of traditional arts in Japan and why and how Javanese karawitan then developed, marked by, among others, the establishment of a gamelan ensembles. This paper is based on the argument that the dissemination of Javanese karawitan to foreign countries, including Japan, was

influenced by the presence of pioneering figures, the existence of communities that are accommodated in karawitan groups, and activities that popularize this Javanese traditional art to wider audiences and supporting communities' into the abstract.

9. Not sure what is meant by 'Mendonca has proven to be able to dispel the interest...'?

10. The conclusion may be better suited to be the abstract as it succinctly provided a structure and flow of the authors' argum

1. The approach and structure taken by the article could be established earlier in the paper to provide the reader with more clarity. In its current condition, it is around page 7-8 that the author's approach becomes clearer - this is slightly late and weakens the article.

2. Examples like this 'This persistent and determined attitude was also shown by members of the Javanese gamelan group in Japan when studying the composition of Javanese drums. First of all, they

always try to play music up to the mark. Second, because they do not have a teacher from Java, they try to find out for themselves the composition of the Javanese gendhing to be played.

addition to learning from gendhing tapes obtained from Java, in a more recent development, they use videos from the Youtube as learning materials' may need a citation or source. 3. Reviewer 2: 1. While the article gives the needed historical context, it is lacking a suitable theoretical grounding and methodological clarification. The methodology should be clear on data collection method and analysis e.g. Facebook pages/accounts, blogs and other social media accounts that made up the primary data for the article. It should be clear the duration or period of time the social media posts that were analysed.

2. Power stands central in cultural studies as it highly influences, generates and determines social relationships. Considering that Japan once occupied Indonesia, does this shared history play any role in Japan's acceptance of Indonesia's Karawitan?

Does this in any way bring power relations to bear? Is there a probability that the acceptance of Javanese karawitan by the seclusive Japanese society influence or determine social relationships between Japan and Indonesia?

3. What is the implication of the findings/conclusions for future research, especially the education sector or learning activities for both nations?

 It may strengthen your paper to refer explicitly to any ethical approval and informed consent processes for all research activities i.e. interviews and observations


